Larry Campbell epitomizes the Christian Kiwanian. He is fully committed to doing the right and moral thing in all cases. He also encourages our Kiwanis Club to do more to help OUR KIDS. He is a leader and willing worker. He has a Kiwanis heart and sets a visible example.

Larry owns and operates, as CEO, a firm that manufactures industrial catalytic systems. His products are credited with removing over one billion tons of pollutants from the air. He employs twenty-one people who meet weekly at noon for volunteer Bible study classes. Two thirds of his employees attend on a regular basis. For many years, Larry's firm sponsored BarBQ picnic outings for the Knox Area Rescue Ministries (KARM) with 100% employees participating. Larry sets a high ethical and moral standard in his workplace.

First United Methodist Church of Maryville is Larry's church home. He is active in many areas serving in leadership positions in the United Methodist Men, Men's Chorus, and Main Choir. Larry is a humble man who doesn't draw attention to his good deeds. That is a major reason for the respect he enjoys in all his roles.

As a committed Christian Man, Larry actively participates in the Blount County Jail Ministry. He presents an ongoing course that provides six, one hour and forty minutes classes. This course is held in a cell block with 40 inmates attending each session. Larry is so devoted to the Jail Ministry Program that he hired four inmates after their release offering employment, encouragement, and mentoring. Despite failure of the first three, Larry listened to his Christian heart and hired one more. So far, the fourth has been a great success. Larry also presented a powerfully moving program on his prison ministries to Maryville Kiwanis.

Despite a busy professional and personal commitment to business and God, Larry devotes the same energy, enthusiasm, and high standards to Maryville Kiwanis projects. He currently serves on the Board of Directors, chairs the Community Services Committee, and is Hole Sponsor Chair for the Maryville Kiwanis Foundation Golf Tournament that raised \$27,000. He also participates in most service projects including tutoring and reading to a struggling young boy at a Blount County elementary school. Larry shows his Kiwanis heart when helping needy people at the Community Food Connection each month. Despite the club's lack of funding, Larry initiated and coordinated the member volunteer funding, procurement, and presentation of an AmTryke tricycle to a pre-teen with spina bifida.
