The dam was built over a 9-year period from 1933 until 1942 to control flooding on the Columbia River in Washington State and to provide irrigation to the farmers in the area. The Grand Coulee was built after the earlier Boulder Dam, now called the Hoover Dam, which harnessed the Colorado River. Both dams were built to provide cheap electricity to people living in those areas, as well as irrigation to grow crops. Both also provided much needed economic stimulus to dig the US out of the Great Depression of the late 1920's and early 1930's. The projects provided lots of long-term work for those who were wandering looking for work and not knowing where there next meal would come from.
