challenges with nuclear-powered vessels as they were deployed. He worked a great deal with nuclear-powered cruisers. He showed us how the cruisers have been stripped and stored since they were decommissioned. They are under guard since they are still radioactive. Michael received the Meritorious Service Medal before his retirement.
