Since she could not be at the meeting, she enlisted Dr. Joelle Romanchik-Cerpovicz, Associate Professor in the Health Sciences and Kinesiology at Georgia Southern University, to introduce the program. Joelle introduced graduate students Kerri Ann Henry and Amanda Lambert,

who presented a program about the Restaurant Health Inspection program of the Georgia Department of Health (GDH). Kerri Ann and Amanda began with an example of a restaurant inspection and a video about poor health practices. The inspection program began as the Federal Meat Inspections Act, followed by the Pure Food Inspection Act. Since approximately 50% of food illnesses are from food served in restaurants, the inspection program makes sure food regulations are being followed. Reports must be posted 10 to 15 ft near the entrance of a restaurant and contain levels of compliance information and details of inspection problems. The GDH website has health inspection information to check about a restaurant you plan to use.
