Mike outlined the steps from the Declaration of Independence, signed on July 4, 1776, which declared the 13 colonies were 13 independent states no longer under British rule; to the Articles of Confederation, signed in 1781, which formed a central government and outlined the 18 powers given to it by the 13 states; to the Treaty of Paris, signed in 1783, which ended the Revolutionary War; and finally to the Constitution, which was ratified in June 21, 1788. The U.S. Constitution is the supreme law of the land, setting up the framework of the federal government. The original document, with its Preamble and seven Articles, has been amended 27 times. Mike noted we should all read and study the document to see the basis of our nation and government.
